Each field of study elects one representative and one alternate. Department representatives have voting power at GSA general meetings.

Serve on a Committee!

GSA represents graduate students on committees around the University for things like libraries, parking, student health, etc.

Be an Officer!

Elections for GSA officers happen each spring. This is a great way to learn about the inner workings of the university and to positively affect the lives of graduate students.

Just show up!

All graduate students are welcome at the bi-weekly meetings, and it is always the more the merrier at social events.

Stay Informed!

GSA's general purpose is to improve the academic, social, and professional lives of UT's graduate students.

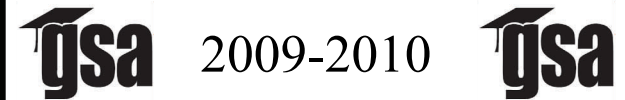
This year GSA is specifically working to:
